Processing Note:

When this collection was found, it was bound into labeled paper bundles, presumably by Levi B. Gillchrest. The present arrangement of the collection is based on those bundles, which have been arranged chronologically.

Related Materials:

Mystic Seaport Museum's Coll. 147 consists of 300 items from Levi B. Gillchrest, mostly letters to Gillchrest from other sea captains, including his father.

Princeton University Library holds an account book signed by J. L. Gillchrest and others which contains accounts for goods and services in the town of Thomaston dated 1816-1819 and some notes from 1855-1859, possibly covering Levi B. Gillchrest's business. Located in the Rare Books and Special Collections - Manuscripts Collection at Princeton University Library.

Historical Note:

Captain Levi Bliss Gillchrest (1833 – 1866) made a fortune as a sea captain doing business in New Orleans, Liverpool, New York City, the Chincha Islands and ports in the Far East and Australia. After the death of his first wife, Levi became a ship's agent and broker for the firm Gillchrest & Patten which became R.L. Gillchrest & Co. and continued after Levi's death. Gillchrest's work was closely tied to his family and at its peak Gillchrest's business owned fifteen ships. These ships participated in the transatlantic trade and also carried cotton from New Orleans, British soldiers to the Caribbean, passengers to Ellis Island and guano from the Chincha Islands. Levi and his captains overcame many dangers including weather, untrustworthy crew and southern privateers during the American Civil War. The last ship constructed by Levi's business was finished after his death and was named after him in 1866. The LEVI B. GILCHREST was commanded by Samuel Watts, a prominent Thomaston sea captains. During his life Levi was married three times; first to Catherine Webb, mother of his children, second to Hortense Harrington and lastly to a Ms. Waterman. He had four children, Frederick Eugene, Ethel, Levi Bliss and Waldo Stetson.

Scope and Content:

The Gillchrest papers provide a window into Levi Bliss Gillchrest's family-centered enterprise and the world of Thomaston's sea captains. This collection covers Levi Bliss Gillchrest's business dealings and relationships with other captains and his family, particularly his son Eugene, up to his death on April 27, 1866 and continues recording his business until 1876. Some of the most notable correspondence was between Levi and his brother Raymond L. Gillchrest.

Levi's business dealings as a shipbuilder and merchant are recorded in numerous receipts, shipping documents and correspondence within the collection. This includes correspondence from the firm of Snow & Burgess in NYC, as well as letters from R.L. Gillchrest & Co. of Liverpool to Capt. Levi Gillchrest from 1864-1866.

The correspondence between Captain Gillchrest and other captains provides insight into their lives and their world. For example, several letters comment on contemporary events such as the battle between the MONITOR and the MERRIMACK during the American Civil War and President Lincoln's assassination. Levi also had correspondence with his father Captain Joseph Gillchrest. These documents also shed some light on the business activities of Levi's son, F. Eugene Gillchrest.
